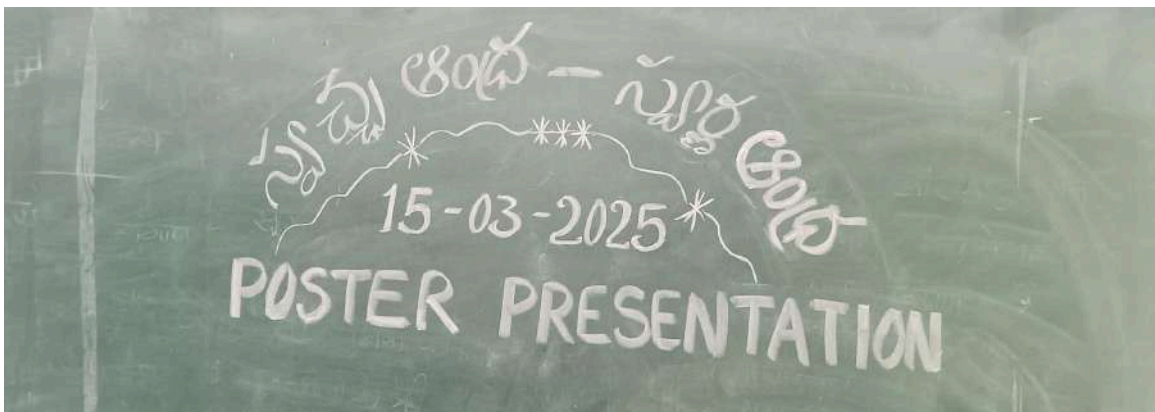

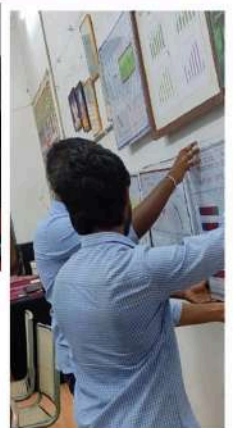
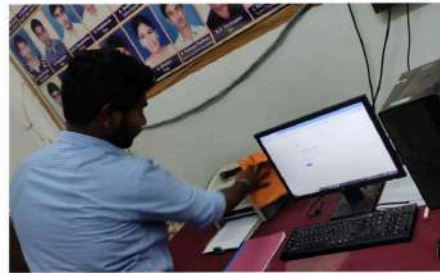

- To educate students and staff on preventive measures for heatstroke.

Description of the Activity:

On 17.05.2025, an awareness programme was conducted at Government Autonomous College, Rajahmundry, under the Swarna Andhra – Swachh Andhra initiative, guided by the Principal, Dr. Ramachandra R.K., on the theme “Beat the Heat.”

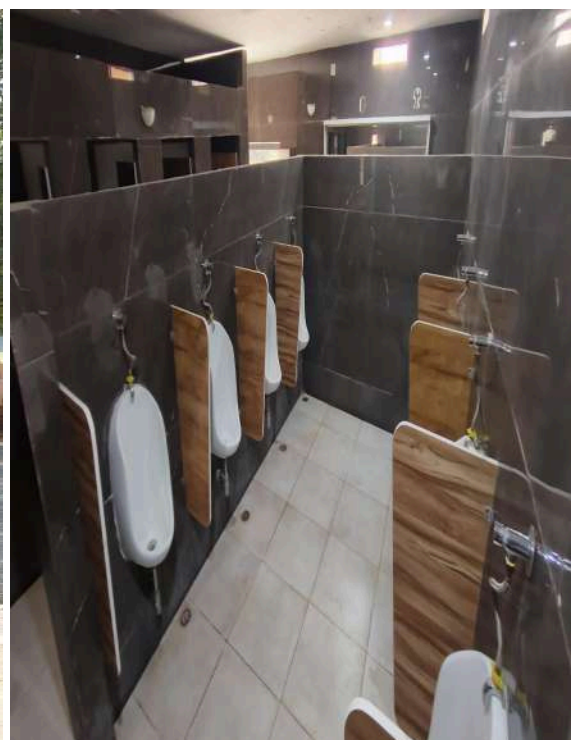
Objectives of the Programme:
